THE EXALTATION OF THE HOLY CROSS

As usual, tea in hand, I stood by the window after my early morning prayers. The sun cast a golden halo over roof tops, the sky fresh and opalescent. Down below Mrs Cat and one other, were at a standoff, yowling, tails flicking, with tight statuesque movements. Gangsters flapped and squabbled around the church eaves making an unholy din; a couple of seagulls up from the coast added to it with haunting cries. Then, as if on cue, the vapour trails of two jets intercepted and made a beautiful white cross against the deepening blue sky... the Cross exalted above the noise and brokenness of the world, I thought!

It is difficult to write about the mystery of the Cross and seems impertinent to do so; what can such a shrivelled, small mind say about such a great and terrible mystery!

'Old Basil' would urge us to sit or stand before an image of the Cross and 'look into it, Gentlemen.' Let the mind settle, thoughts dissipate, heart soften. Keep looking. See the bruised, blooded, twisted body, nailed painfully to the cross. Feel the pain, the hurt the injustice... but don't get sentimental. Keep looking and then, perhaps, the Cross will become a mirror for the soul. Slowly with each drop of blood, each tare of the skin, you will see the pain, hurt, confusion, sorrow and sins of your own life. The lies, dishonesty, thefts, addictions, frustrations, angers, disappointments, sexual difficulties and distortions; the longing for comfort and security and something, oh something, that will make sense of the event we call life but so often feels like death. And, if we keep looking and get past all the 'stuff of our lives' we might see His face looking back at us; no anger, no rebukes just perfect understanding, rest, acceptance and Love beyond all telling.

It is this Love that makes sense of it all. It is this love that helps us accept who and what we are. It takes us beyond our self, away from who we thought we were into who we truly are... one with Christ. This is an exhalation of the Cross; a resurrection from the old to the new. So, rather than discuss the Cross it might do better to meditate *into it;* feel how we are one with it and let it become our instrument of resurrection, our happiness and exaltation.

CANONISATION OF SAINTS CARLO ACUTIS & PIER GIORGIO FRASSATI

Last Sunday 7 September 2025, the Church joyfully celebrated the canonisation of two remarkable young Catholics whose lives continue to inspire people around the world.

Saint Carlo Acutis

Born in 1991, Carlo was a teenager with a deep love for the Eucharist and a gift for technology. He created a website documenting Eucharistic miracles to help others grow in faith. Carlo died of leukemia at just 15, offering his suffering for the Church. He is now known as the first millennial saint and a powerful example of holiness in the digital age.

Saint Pier Giorgio Frassati

Born in 1901 in Turin, Pier Giorgio was a university student who lived out the Gospel through service to the poor and a joyful spirit. He was active in Catholic groups and loved mountain climbing, often combining his adventures with prayer and reflection. He died at 24, and his life earned him the title 'Man of the Beatitudes'.

Parish Pilgrimage to Glastonbury – Diocese Pilgrimage 2025

On Sunday, parishioners from Salisbury & Amesbury joined pilgrims from across the Diocese of Clifton for the annual diocesan pilgrimage to The Shrine of Our Lady of Glastonbury, held this year under the theme "Mary, Woman of Hope."

Parishioners travelled together by coach, while children and staff from St Joseph's Catholic School came by minibus. We all met on arrival in Glastonbury and shared the day's programme of prayer and pilgrimage.

The celebrations included the Rosary, Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, the Sacrament of Reconciliation, and Benediction in the Shrine Church. In the Abbey Grounds, pilgrims took part in the Jubilee procession, healing prayer at the Chapel of Healing, and the Rosary procession through the town centre.

The day culminated in a moving open-air Mass at 3.15pm in the Abbey grounds, with the ruins of the ancient abbey providing a powerful and prayerful backdrop to the liturgy, celebrated by Bishop Bosco MacDonald.

We arrived home to Salisbury at 7pm tired but happy.
