# ADVENT WEEK 3 (C) GAUDETE SUNDAY

# From Father Anthony

It was a cold clear night. Stars sparkled like Christmas lights across the velvety blackness. By contrast, morning arrived on the wings of a storm. Daubed in ink and chalk dust by a divine thumb, clouds twisted and swirled across the sky in tight embrace; wringing out torrents of rain driven horizontally by ferocious winds. Trees swayed violently, the last of their leaves scattering; the hedge shivered and shook; the path was scoured clean. Needless to say, the Gunslinger, Gangsters and Brown Sparrows were nowhere to be seen... nor Mrs Cat! When the storm abated it was eerily bare and silent: severe yet refreshing.

Heaven: His winnowing fan is in his hand. The winnowing fan is often used in scripture as an image of how God will shake up humanity at the end of time separating the good from the bad. It is also an image of what happens to the individual soul when it surrenders itself into the arms of Jesus. Winnowing is a process by which grain is separated from chaff, dirt and dust. Each one of us is the image of God attempting to become His likeness: this is the grain. All that we think we are or have allowed others or the world to convince us that we are... this is the chaff, the dirt and the dust; it hinders expression of our true image. When we come to understand this; when we surrender ourselves to Jesus, who is Our Lord, Master and Friend, then, in friendship and love, He will shake away what is false and inauthentic. The light of His Presence will reveal to us who we truly are; in that recognition we willingly cast aside all that we are not as so much rubbish to be burnt up and discarded. From a living being we transform into a life-giving spirit.

This heavenly transformation begins now by practicing the Gospel exhortations: share with one another: take no more than is needed: offer others what we have left over: don't gossip or talk about others behind their backs: be satisfied with what Providence gives us. This helps us relax: it frees us from constant attempts to either get or make ourselves *into* something. We are something *already...* the image of God attempting to become His likeness. By putting God and others first, we live the life of Love, rather than of self-preoccupation... Heaven on earth.



## GAUDETE SUNDAY - 15 DECEMBER

On this, the third Sunday of Advent or Gaudete Sunday, we sense a definite mood change. The austerity of what can be a sombre though hope-filled penitential season is replaced by a shift of emphasis.
