From Father Anthony

It was a lovely day. Mrs Cat sprawled languidly atop the garden wall, soaking up the rays. She glanced at me imperiously as I locked the sacristy door after Mass. Spivs sounded like football rattles warning of her presence. She took no notice. The gunslinger monitored proceedings high up from an olive branch. I made some tea, opened the post and waited for a couple. They arrived, we had a good chat and I signed references in support of them becoming citizens of another country. It would be sad to see them go.

'Our citizenship is in heaven', says St Paul. Last week we were invited to join Jesus in the desert, a metaphor for the interior life and Lent. He was tempted by the devil; so are we. The 'three temptations' point toward three traditional obstacles to spiritual growth. These obstacles keep us as citizens of the world rather than citizens of heaven; living beings rather than life giving spirits. Lent (from Lenten old English for spring season) is a time for identifying and rising above these earthbound obstacles (climbing the mountain with Jesus) for the higher ground of spirit. The obstacles are Resentment, Envy and Pride.

Resentment is wanting things to be other than they are (turn these stones into bread). Envy is the worship of wanting what someone else has (worship me and I'll give you all the kingdoms of the world). Pride is believing we are special above others; normal customs and laws do not apply to me (throw yourself down). Identifying this in our lives is climbing the mountain. As we 'climb', Resentment is transformed into Heavenly Wisdom (Moses), Envy into Heavenly Power (Elijah) and Pride into Love (Jesus). We are transformed in body, soul and spirit (three tents). We cease listening to and following the strident, beguiling but impotent voice of the world and begin to hear the voice of the Father claiming us as His daughters and sons; residents of His house and citizens of heaven here on earth.

Resentment, envy and pride are the nightmarish daydreams that keep us from recognising and embracing the spiritual being we are *(they were overcome by sleep)*. Release from them awakens us to our spiritual nature *(Peter and his companions became fully awake)*. Fully awakened to our spiritual nature *(transfigured)* we bring the characteristics of Moses, Elijah and Jesus to the world and transfigure it too.

This Easter, we will be welcoming seven adults into full communion with the church across the pastoral area of St Edith. Three of them were able to attend the Rite of Election at Clifton Cathedral on Saturday 8 March along with friends, family and sponsors. It is a wonderfully joyful service when we as the Faithful recognise that God has called them to his church and that they are ready to receive the sacraments of initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist). This Rite is the second step in the Rites of Christian Initiation, when they make a firm intention of continuing conversion.
