From Father Anthony...

Night. Moonlight filtered through the blinds casting diagonals over the floor. Icy air floated through the open window. It brushed my forehead and drifted up my nose. I lay snug under the duvet feeling comfortable, cosy and relaxed. I enjoyed the air. I listened to the quiet; a jet, high overhead, occasional traffic, rustles in the garden. Then, a car alarm went off, riding the air up and down. Irritation gave way to panic... my car! I was up, dressing gown on, down the stairs and out the front door. I key fobbed the car... silently apologising to the neighbours. I'm sure I was popular! The street looked hard and cold, blocks of shadows washed by silvery light. Stars twinkled in a dark clear sky and... too quick to follow, a shooting star!

Most of us have a place in our mind where we habitually live when we're not thinking about other things. More money, bigger house, better job, becoming a celebrity, nursing a grudge, feeling picked on. Regardless of the effect, we become comfortable with it; like a duvet it keeps us snug against a perceived cold world; it can also become a trap.

As we become aware of 'where we live' we might sense that, 'there might be a better way'. Awakening and aware, our higher mind (John) looks in a new direction (stares). We feel the Lamb (Christ) within; we sense a better way. We focus on it (follow). Freed from the 'habitual mind' we become unsure of ourselves (what do you want). Attracted by this 'better way' we want to know more (where do you live). The answer we hear is 'come and see' (be you coming and be you perceiving; i.e. come out of your mental world and look deeply into the mind of Christ).

To follow Christ within; to recognise and leave our habitual mental world requires strong desire and intention to do so (*Andrew*). Andrew brings forth his brother Simon (*the ability to hear and discern what is not of God*). This develops faith through experience (*Peter*). It does not happen overnight (*they stayed with him until the tenth hour*). Ten is the Hebrew letter *yod*; it means a hand, a creative force; undifferentiated consciousness: the realm of *causes*, not *effects*. Here we are one with God. *It is a lifetime's work*. It is where Christ lives and where we must live also.

Saint Wulfstan (Wulstan), Bishop - 19 January

St Wulfstan of Worcester, 'sole survivor of the old Fathers of the English people'. Famous for being one of the few high-ranking English churchmen to keep his position after the Norman Conquest. When Wulfstan died in 1095 he was the only English-born bishop left in England, and the stories told about him claim he was respected by Normans and the English alike, not just for his personal holiness but, in a way, as a relic of the Anglo-Saxon church, which was so comprehensively taken over by Norman prelates after the Conquest. Saint Agnes, Virgin, Martyr - 21 January

On 21 January the Catholic Church honours the virgin and martyr St. Agnes, who suffered death for her consecration to Christ. Although the details of Agnes' life are mostly unknown, the story of her martyrdom has been passed on with reverence since the fourth century. On the feast day of the young martyr – whose name means "lamb" in Latin – the Pope traditionally blesses lambs, whose wool will be used to make the white pallium worn by archbishops.
