From Father Anthony

Giving thanks for air conditioning I sat in the jalopy, nose to tail in a traffic jam. Outside it was sweltering. A tired mother, three fractious children and a push chair ambled slowly along the pavement and overtook us. I was going to be late! Soon, I was finding fault with 'our road systems', 'those who plan road works' and then cursing 'this and that'. No thought of, 'should have left earlier, checked and taken a different route'. The hypocrisy I railed against in others was displayed in front of me as I checked the rear-view mirror. Eventually I laughed. It was life. Forgive it, let it be; God is in this moment too.

The Gospel passage continues the reality of Forgiveness. Old Basil would constantly remind us that, 'to be truly able to forgive others one must have a real sense of having been forgiven', that, 'the creature you are is the creature God created; the creature that God loves, understands, accepts and wants to transform into the likeness of Himself... as you'. We are the clay that He, the Potter, wants to mould by the effects of His Love. God, 'gives before hand'; He sees, like a sculptor, the beautiful image contained within a lump or marble. Our knowledge and acceptance of His forgiveness for the life we are living is the chisel that cuts out the form we must become: His likeness. When we have a profound sense of being accepted, understood and loved by, 'Our Father in Heaven', we understand that it must also be true for our brother and sister. God does not have favourites. He loves all He has created; the speck of dust, the tiny bug, the beautiful cat, dog or donkey, the swift bird, the massive solar system and... you and I. We assist the love of God by seeing what He sees in another; which is only a reflection of Himself, who created it. We join His work of forgiveness. We Love; that is, we prefer what the other prefers. Which means, we have to go beyond ourselves; die to and deny the little me that always wants to be the centre of attention with the world revolving round us.

This is practical, rather than theoretical, Christianity. It is 'going into the kitchen to make a cup of coffee... rather than talking about it'... and confusing the talk with reality.
