From Father Anthony.

It has been busy recently: I've found myself immersed in church business and worldly things; no time for the garden and that cup of tea. So it was lovely to sit out early one morning, tea in hand, and connect with my shorn, bedraggled friend. The Gunslinger made an appearance and Gangsters danced on the lawn as if they were going to 'do me over'! And, as the sun came up, my mind began to clear like a small awakening, and I felt a little sorrow for all the things I had neglected.

"When Joseph awoke", The word translated as 'awoke' is egeiró (ἐγείρω): it has a

root that includes 'to collect one's faculties', and possibly, 'to come to one's senses'. A question that we may have to ask ourselves and a question the world in general must ask of itself is... are we in our right mind, our right senses? Are we 'collected', using our faculties correctly? It is a tough question to get to grips with because it can expose ignorance, cowardice, selfishness, stupidity, a tendency to run with the crowd and hide behind useless human laws and conventions and much more. It exposes the extent to which we are truly self-aware or still slumbering and asleep, confusing effect or appearance for cause; in short how we trade off the Divine Law and Will for us, for self-protection, self-promotion and crowd thinking. No wonder we run from it! If we don't run, we might find ourselves in Saint Joseph's predicament... torn between doing the right thing or bending to human norms? He exercises compassion; he listens beyond the sterile noise and norms of society. This readys his heart for exposure to the Divine in the form of an angel and then to follow what he is commanded to do. This command is not only about taking Mary, the person, as his wife but also, taking on and protecting in himself the quality which she represents... to rebel against and push away all that is not of God so that the Divine may be born through her and in him too.

This Christmas and always Our Lord is longing to be born again in you and me. Unless He is the world will continue as it is: reducing intelligence to the artificial and human beings to lifeless obedient machines. Let's awaken, listen, love and choose His Life over death.

FORTHCOMING CHANGES TO THE SUNDAY & WEEKDAY MASS SCHEDULE

I well remember being told that three things were necessary for the smooth establishment of weekly Mass: *a person, a time and a place...* "mess with any of these and you will confuse and lose your congregations", said the wise old priest!

Well, we did mess with it!!! and you have borne the inconvenience and confusion with understanding, grace and encouragement. Just to recap: back in the summer we went down to three priests, then two and for a short while, one. It was impossible to cover all the Masses and as a result the 11am at St Osmund's was cancelled displacing over 150 people. St Gregory's moved from 9am to 11am causing not a little confusion, unrest and overcrowding. At the time we said it was an interim measure – although, if I'm honest, I thought it would be permanent.

However, two things have happened. Firstly, our Mass numbers at St Osmund's, in terms of safety, are dangerously high leading to people being invited to watch Mass on screens in the hall – hardly ideal. Secondly, the Bishop has secured a fourth priest for us - Fr George who will live in Amesbury and serve both Christ the King and St George's, Warminster. This makes it possible to 'mess with the rota again' and return to the previous Sunday Mass timetable here in Salisbury.

I was minded to keep the Mass times as they are because we *could* be back to three priests next summer and may have all the confusion again. However, I have been persuaded that we must reinstate the 11am at St Osmund's and return the 11am at St Gregory's back to 9am; if for no other reason than to cope with the increased numbers at each of our Masses in the interests of safety. I will have to worry about next summer when it comes!

Therefore, it is my intention to implement the Mass timetable as shown below:

Saturday Vigil Mass	St Gregory	Remains at 5pm
Sunday Masses	St Osmund	Remains at 9am
	St Osmund	Reinstate 11am
	St Osmund	Ordinariate Mass - Remains at 12:30pm
	St Osmund	Remains at 6pm
	St Gregory	Returns to 9am from 11am

This will take effect from SUNDAY 8 FEBRUARY.

This will have implications for Family of Faith which will now return to the Parish Centre in Exeter Street with families arriving after their respective 9am Mass at St Osmund & St Gregory.

Weekday Schedule Changes

St Osmund Reinstate the **Monday 10am Mass**

St Osmund (Ordinariate) Will move from Monday to Tuesday at 6pm

Benediction Will begin at 5.30pm on both Tuesdays & Thursdays in St Osmund.

On Tuesdays, this will be followed by the Angelus at 6pm, immediately

prior to the Ordinariate Mass.

At the end of the day 'the buck stops with me' and after much consultation I have made this decision for which I take full responsibility. I am sorry for the disruption, but I hope you will understand and support the decision.
