ORDINARY TIME WEEK (29A)

From Father Anthony

'Glory be to God for dappled things', wrote Gerard Manly Hopkins in his poem Pied Beauty, 'For skies of couple colour as a brinded cow....' I sat on high ground overlooking the Chase: a patchwork of coloured beauty tumbling away to meet the horizon with a rouged kiss from the setting sun. People ask where God is. All around is surely the answer.

We spoke about Awareness being an innate faculty by which we can illuminate our thoughts, emotions and actions and measure them against conscience. Awareness aids discernment and spiritual development. It is a function of but also leads to Christ, within: the true light. We often live under the compulsion or tyranny of a personal will bereft of the spiritual qualities of love, mercy and justice (Caesar). We spiral towards the opposite poles of spiritual dreaming and revulsion of material things on the one hand (Luciferic) or pure materialism without a thought or care for the spiritual on the other (Satanic). We become distorted. Our lives become loops rather than straight lines: we repeat the same mistakes over and over again and wonder why life treats us so badly! This can be a sign of imbalance in need of correction: only we can apply the correction. How?

Jesus offers a way. He says to the Herodians, 'whose likeness is this?' Similarly, we must use awareness to discern whose likenesses a particular thought, feeling or action resembles. Is it Lucifer, Satan or Christ? A clue is given. When the authorities ask Jesus if it is right to pay taxes (tribute) the word used is kensos, κῆνσος. It means a poll-tax but also, 'to muzzle'. Are or thoughts, feelings or actions muzzling us? Do they constrain us to the extent that we feel something deeper is being stifled? If so, we should consider a change of mind and heart. (repentance). Awareness gives us a chance to, 'give back to Caesar what is Caesar's', i.e. what stifles and distorts us... leave it outside the door, some might say!

Even if we cannot actually do it the awareness of it and the understanding of what needs to change or transform is a real beginning. It creates a separation between the seer and the seen. In that separation the true light of Christ can increase until it illuminates (grounds) our spiritual being in the world for the benefit of others and the world.


