From Father Anthony

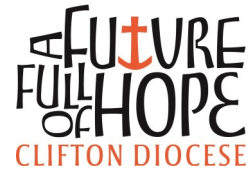
It was lovely to be by the sea again, to hear the gulls and breathe salty air; to hear the crash of waves and the crackle of pebbles as the waves retreated. I took in the wide blue sky, the distant line of the horizon and ships anchored outside the harbour. I sat, stilled my mind and relaxed... and got a sense of the immensity, mystery and beauty of God: beyond comprehension or description. Yet God felt close too. A couple came by chatting. He held his daughter, her head resting on his shoulder asleep. That's how close we are to God, I thought, if we trust Him, rest in Him and give everything to Him: *Unless you become like little children...*

A most fruitful spiritual practice is to come into the Presence of God. However, God is so big, so 'other', that the mind cannot cope; it has nothing to measure such immensity by and generally the experience of the presence of God is the experience of darkness or unknowing! But... the Presence or Fullness of God is invested in Jesus. He and the Father are one. He is God made Man, the Second Person of the Trinity: through whom *everything* was made. So, coming into the presence of Jesus is not coming into the presence of an alien but a person like us; God made tangible, accessible and knowable: where we experience 'family resemblance' with our Creator.

This is one reason why we should cultivate a sense of the reality of Jesus as a true living human being; not a notion, an idea, a concept, a mythical character from a dubious history. All of the latter equate to idols: they are distractions, projections of the mind: there is no life in them. Whereas, we want Him to affect and make an impression on our hearts and minds as happens in all true relationships.

Experiencing the reality of Jesus, we experience our own reality because being created in, by and for Him we experience our origin and destiny. If we want to know or experience this (*if we want to be first*) the Gospel basically tells us to *get out of the way of ourselves* and all we *think* we are; to humble our beliefs, intellect and pride; in effect, to become *servants* who find themselves in the Mind and Heart of their Master; children carried in His arms.

There will be no confessions tomorrow Saturday 21 September after the 10am Mass at St Osmund. Confessions as usual from 5.30pm at St Gregory

Fr Martin Queenan, current parish priest in Warminster has been appointed by Bishop Bosco to serve as a parish priest in the Forest of Dean. Due to declining clergy numbers, there will be no resident priest in Warminster from the beginning of October and that parish will be served by the current priests of our Pastoral Area (St Edith of Wilton). Fr Anthony is to be appointed parish priest. In due course, this will have an impact on many aspects of the life of our parishes as our priests serve larger areas.
