PALM SUNDAY & HOLY WEEK

From Father Anthony

Twists of rose gold, cornflower blue and burnished copper, garlanded the horizon. The sun announced its arrival with easy flamboyance. It rose inexorably above the light it scattered upon good, bad and indifferent alike. The world, in turn, woke from slumber and climbed out of the land of shadows bowing before the light. I felt drab, in comparison: a black suit and little splash of white around the throat. A man whistled a jaunty tune, happy with the day so far; straying seagulls sang of the coast... and, Mrs Cat gave a long meow at my lack of attention!

Let us be under no illusion: the encounter with Christ is the most marvellous experience every human being will have, however they dress up the language or understand the tradition out of which they experience it. It is an experience akin to rising out of darkness into light, a movement from physical to spiritual sensation; an awakening, a resurrection. When we encounter Christ the coltish nature of the mind is controlled (Jesus rides the donkey) by a single desire and intention, a single focus. No longer is the mind straining here, seeking there and confused everywhere. The controlled mind is able to focus on an objective; Jerusalem, i.e. Union with the Divine, including, Peace, Harmony, Power, Wisdom, Understanding. Before it, all other thoughts bow down; not to be subdued but tested to see if they are fit for purpose. And what is the purpose? Passion and Resurrection. As a moth becomes one with the flame it circles, likewise, we become one with God; we return to the image of God we actually are by controlling the mind: letting go of images we think we are but are not. Awareness grows of how the Divine crucifies Itself on the body of mankind by dreaming itself to be what it conceives: so that mankind might awaken and rise as the Divine out of whom it is created and sustained. The physical images of crucifixion and death are painful and distressing; the spiritual experience is blissful and consoling; rather like being cured of an intense painful disease.

Banner headlines of being a people of Light or a people of the Resurrection are so much jargon unless there is real Light and Resurrection. When we enter the lives of others it must be Christ they experience entering and lighting up the Jerusalem of their hearts.




