From Father Anthony...

It was cold and damp. Leaves rustled as something moved about. A distant motor bike roared and broke the lengthening silence. A bat skittered about. I sat huddled. High to my right, the moon *(a waxing gibbous)* sparkled as it reflected the hidden sun. A wide shaft of silvery light spilled across the lawn and splashed against the side of the church. Dark cavities gaped where the stained glass was. Devoid of colour I sat amid a world of shadows and outlines with thoughts about direct and reflected light.

The sun brings so much warmth, colour, definition and brightness. And yet you cannot look at it with the naked eye. To see it you must *conceal it* – wear dark glasses or catch its reflection off something else. In a similar way the scriptures and most spiritual writers are unanimous that God cannot be directly 'seen' or approached. God is too vast, all encompassing, too bright to take in... *to see God is to die, (Exodus 33.20).* In a sense, we can only experience God by concealing God, by reducing God's vast magnificence to something we can understand and process; the ability to do this is itself, of course, God gift to us. His perfect concealment, and therefore revelation, is Christ (*John 1.18*). And... Christ is found within.

Initially we experience this concealment through intellect: our ability to reason, think and ponder. Intellect, like the moon, operates through reflected light: the light of God. When we confuse reflected light as self generated light, we create interior darkness; we become blind to truth. In spiritual practice - through study, meditation and work on our character - we experience the reality of not being the author of our own being. We are created. In this 'light' we extend beyond the intellect, ideas and fantasies to find the perfect concealment of God within... Christ.

Faith urges us to leave Jericho ($i\pi\gamma\gamma$ fragrant, moon, intellect). It reveals us as beggars by the wayside of our own lives, like Bartimaeus (from Aramaic bar , $\gamma\gamma$ son and tame ,son of uncleanliness). Faith reveals that intellect alone brings 'uncleanliness' (interior blindness), unless experienced as a reflection of Christ. Then, Bartimaeus's other meaning is experienced (bar, son and Greek $\tau\mu\eta$, timē, Timaeus) which means 'son of honour': a move from negative to positive. This understanding *is* an experience of Christ within, our faith has made (us) whole.
