# From Father Anthony

I arrived back from Bristol hot, tired and irritable: but, it had been good to see the Bishop and some colleagues. The outside of the church was covered in confetti and looked magical; it softened my nerves. I helped Fr Joseph clear up, made tea and sat outside. A fat, fluffy, baby blackbird hopped over and stared at me. I made some petting noises and offered some biscuit; but it turned away, hopped across the lawn and got on with its business.

'Many of his disciples turned away and walked with him no more'. The Gospel continues with the theme of, I Am the bread of life. In history some disciples found this teaching unacceptable and we may too! But, Jesus tells us His Words are Spirit and Life. He is not only talking about physical bread but spiritual bread, i.e. the Word (Voice) of God, found at the core of our being: the place we call, I Am: the place where we fuse with God who also calls Himself I AM. If we empty ourselves of attachments to things, thoughts and worldly voices then we have a chance of hearing the Voice of God within. Then the Child (Son) of Man (Soul) within, will remember its spiritual origin, where it came from; we will ascend to where we were before.

If we do not attempt to control our physical and mental appetites, tame our desires, control the chattering mind and practice self-denial; if we do not clear the decks, so to speak, then the Voice of God will be drowned out by the voices of the world. The voice of our little ego will reign supreme, at best: at worst it will actively attempt to crush the Voice of God within and silence it in others, *he knew who would betray him*.

If not already, then at some stage, we have to choose between the world and Christ; not just intellectually but by the life we lead. A way of life that includes prayer and self-denial in order to actively empty ourselves of ourselves and worldly influences, so that God can be heard and manifested within. Then, to see us will be to see the Father within us; so that we may heal a broken world by leading it away from itself back to God its Creator... the Bread come down from Heaven: which we will have become too.
