From Father Anthony...

I felt like a 'bake in the bag'. It was evening but still hot. I poured myself out of the office, threw water over my face and went out. Cabbage Whites fluttered along the Cathedral walls; traffic shimmered in the heat. The sky was a mixture of candy floss and ocean blue. The sun blazed as it fell away. People moved languidly around the Close; sun tan lotion and smiles. A mother coped with her hot, hectoring children. Dad came along with an armful of wrapped parcels. They all sat down on the grass, opened them and tucked into fish and chips. Hmmm.

We have seen how, with our faculties gathered and complete, in Christ, we gain interior unity: our perspective on life transforms. We use time for awareness of who and what we are rather than on perfunctory doing. We rise above the *crowd* of unruly and unguided thoughts and have compassion on them. Being unified, we are motivated by inner spirit: we begin to use our faculties (*spiritual development*) to reshape thought and transform material senses to reflect the image of spirit. So far, we have allowed the world to set the agenda and followed it. Now, we must set a spiritual agenda that the world might follow (*feed them yourself*).

Faced with the magnitude of old ways of thinking *(crowds)* the faculty of mind *(Philip)* realises that it is not equipped for the task *(money to buy food represents earthly thinking)*. Andrew *(strength through faith)* understands that only the spiritual soul *(I Am)* can do it. This is the child with five loaves and two fish *(five senses and material and spiritual soul)*. It is this 'child' that faith 'brings' to Christ; in Him it will develop beyond the material soul.

We use time to still our worldly senses - five thousand (*five senses*) seated on grass (grass withers and fades... symbol of time). We become aware of our physical and mental attachments... 'the old person'. These must be pulled apart (dividing the loaves and fishes) as our faculties (disciples) spiritually reshape (feed) the way we think and use our senses. As thought and sense is fed by spirit the spiritual soul takes command. Our twelve faculties fulfil their task (twelve baskets full); we become a 'new person', with thought and senses controlled spiritually ... from a 'living soul we become a life-giving spirit' (1 Cor 15: 45).

From Father Anthony

In light of the recent Government Announcement we have received Guidance from the Bishops Conference of England and Wales. Caution, common sense and sensitivity towards others are watchwords along with careful appraisal of the risk levels in our area. This, at a time, when many of our Pastoral Team and Congregation are taking Annual Leave. In the interests of safety, sensitively towards the concerns of many parishioners and time to accurately assess all implications I, in consultation with our Pastoral Team, have taken the view that we will continue with no substantial changes for the time being. That is, we will:

Continue to book for Mass; please do not turn up without booking, just for a while longer!

Encourage everyone to continue wearing a mask in our churches

Maintain social distancing Continue with hand and bench sanitising

Continue the practice of good ventilation in our churches

We will consider revised guidance to the parish by mid-August and again, if necessary, at the end of August.
