From Father Anthony

It had been a long hard drive and wet. After some excellent homemade food I quickly fell asleep and slept in late. I woke to a grey, overcast sky. Mist hung low over the sea. Gulls filled the air with laments. Rolling and folding on themselves, waves lapped the shoreline, drawing sand under. I listened to natures sounds and caught mental echoes of yesterday's lovely children's mass at Tisbury and the solemn, mystical plainchant at Wardour. Two styles, one worship.

And having rolled up the scroll, having returned it to the attendant, He sat down and all eyes in the synagogue gazed intently upon Him. In worship we gaze intently upon Him. Not with physical eyes but with the eyes of soul and the intuition of spirit. Beautiful as our prayers may be; as wonderful as our Liturgies are: as enjoyable as our coming together to worship Him is: there must be a moment when we allow Him to roll it all up, so as to reveal Himself as He is. The whole of the Law and the Prophets: the content of all the Gospels are nothing if they are not about and lead us to Him. It is easy confuse form with essence. Jesus, is essence. He, in and as Himself, is the fulfilment of all our individual and collective forms of worship.

If we have become tired, set in our ways, uncompromising, covered in the mist of our own understanding, rigidly arguing for our way... then, perhaps we should take some time out! Very often we get into a loop, a one dimensional manner of thinking, feeling and being: going round and round. This is our Galilee - Galilee means circle, circuit, cylinder. Little growth can occur here; like a gyro we are all in a spin and going nowhere!. If so, it might be good to recall the story of Jesus as we know it and tell it to Theophilus (Theophilus means lover of God), i.e. that part of ourselves that loves and desires God. And, in telling the story to ourselves, allow Jesus to enter into the circuits of our minds and hearts: let Him enter the synagogue of our being (synagogue means 'coming together' - the coming together of our thoughts, feeling and understandings). Then, allow Him to roll up our stories, gazing intently, as He fulfils them by revealing Himself, as He is, in us.
