ADVENT WEEK 1 (A)

From Father Anthony

As if by an unseen hand, a corner of the dark ruffled sky was peeled back like a quilt cover. Yellows, pinks and blues, suffused by soft, brooding light, blended together and heralded a new day. The brown sparrows erupted in chorus and did a wingover: someone whistled for their dog. Then, another unseen hand pulled the cover back again and plunged the world into drab greyness... and more rain! I packed my things, wound up the jalopy and made for Tisbury, the early morning light just a memory.

At the beginning of scripture, we read that God created the heavens) הַשַּׁמֵים haš·šā·ma·yim) and the earth) הַאָרֵץ: hā·ʾā·retṣ). Spiritually, there is a complex sense in which we can understand heavens and earth to refer to the inner and outer person (2 Cor 4). In the Gospel passage we read that one will be taken, one left. Again, a similar understanding; one left working or grinding is the outer person: the one taken (by the angels) is the spiritual person. Among other things, this Gospel passage reflects on these two sides of human nature indicating that we need to let them develop so as to experience them as one.

Advent is a time to pay attention to this development. It is a time to understand with the feeling of our soul that we need to wake up from being solely a material person to the enlightenment of being a spiritual person. The darkness associated with Advent, once again, points to the outer person lost in the darkness of a material world. Into this darkness there is the light of our spiritual soul represented by the light of candles increasing in number and luminosity week by week. The symbolism is lovely: the reality even better. There should be no fear of losing the material world; on the contrary, it is precisely this world we want to keep and love by infusing it with the Spirit. Far from despising it we want to heal and renew it.

In the waters of Baptism, we died to the world in order to rise with Christ to new life. Let us welcome the waters of our spiritual understanding so that it may wash over and refresh the tired, sometimes unbearable darkness of life trapped in our material world. The good news is that if we can spot the darkness... we must be standing in the light!
