From Father Anthony

.It took over five hours driving in the dark. I arrived tired and weary... it was worth it. Icy, sea air embraced me and filled my lungs with that special mixture of ozone, seaweed and salt. I breathed deeply and unpacked. After some delectable home made soup and exquisite home made bread I slept like a babe until the sun was two hands high. Later, along the coast, huge waves foamed and tossed their heads like wild horses: they tumbled, barrelled and thumped against the seawall exploding like giant water bombs. Gulls wheeled and screeched. There were no fishermen mending their nets that day! It was a magnificence of confusion and chaos.

Last week the disciples left their boats and their nets to follow Jesus. Spiritually they left the confused, chaotic, confined limitation of sensory, everyday consciousness for the vast unbroken plane or 'net' of pure, unbounded, spiritual consciousness: from where all creation takes place. They did this to further their own spiritual development but also to teach others and lead them to the Truth. They were to become 'fishers of men'.

What they are to teach they must learn and experience for themselves. Nothing theoretical here! Jesus takes them to the synagogue, (a gathering place). Spiritually it represents the gathering place of sensory thoughts and ideas (mentality). Amid the diversity, confusion and error found here Jesus Himself must be heard and experienced; i.e. our deepest consciousness, the I AM, must command. Its voice, its approach, is fresh, new and invigorating (teaches with authority): it leaves us astonished by how we have mistakenly trusted to our sensory, individual consciousness to give us all we need... astonished by how it fails to do so. We have become a 'village of sorrows' (meaning of Capernaum). Here we must learn there is only one Truth (Christ) expressed through many individuals: not many individuals expressing limited ideas of their truth. In the face of Truth the soul limited by ideas of truth is 'unclean' and feels threatened (have you come to destroy us). Its ideas of truth must be dispelled so that it might come from Truth in all it does.

This is a purification we must all go through. It is not a punishment but rather, an attitude God has towards us. Capernaum also means comfort in sorrow. God comforts with the Truth and by liberating us from false ideas of it.
