# ORDINARY TIME WEEK 17(B)

#### **From Father Anthony**

It was early morning and hot already. I donned a cap, shouldered the daysack - with its thermos of tea - and set off. I skirted a lake, departed the track and squeezed through towering foliage bound together by bindweed. I found a spot by the stream and 'made camp'. Traffic rumbled, far away; nearby a train cleared its throat and hooted. A chiffchaff diced the silence and was answered, in the distance, by the delightful two-tone echo of a cuckoo. I sat, stretched and rested: water trickled and gurgled: the air was filled with insects buzzing and dancing in the sunlight.

If not so already, the Lord is going to do marvellous things in your life and mine when the time is right. It will be His doing not ours. He will teach us to "cross to the other side of the sea of Galilee, that is, the sea of Tiberius". Spiritually, Galilee represents our *life force* or *activity* and Tiberias means, 'to pass over'. Our power is at its greatest when we allow Him to transport us to "the other side", our spiritual side; we must pass over from the outer to the inner. All our thoughts and emotions will follow too (the crowds) and come under His power, teaching and healing.

However, there is a requirement... "Jesus said, make the people recline. Now there was a lot of grass in that place. So, the men reclined, about five thousand in number". Once again, we have the theme of rest, (make them recline), the theme of time (there was a lot of grass there – grass is a symbol of time, it withers and fades) and the theme of prayer, (the five thousand waiting expectantly on Him to act). Spiritually we must use time to rest in prayerful expectancy. When we have cleared a space for Him in our daily lives, He will act in His own time; He will take the tools of our life, our five senses (five loaves) and the upper and lower aspects of soul that utilises them (two fish). He will order them correctly using our mind (Philip) and our spiritual strength (Andrew) embedded in faith (Peter). When our soul and senses are correctly ordered in favour of Spirit our twelve spiritual faculties, will operate correctly (twelve baskets). This is the miracle, related in the Gospel, He will perform in you and me.
