From Father Anthony...

Fine rain hung like mist as I made my way along St John's and up Catherine Street. A car hooted, I waved. As always, the market was a delightful mix of colours and spicy aromas. Stalls overflowed, people stood and chatted, garments fluttered in the stirring breeze. I had a laugh with the baker, discussed cricket over the cheese and ham and queued for salad and vegetables. Amid calls for 'two a pound', a voice rasped to someone, 'I dunno mate, we've always done it that way'.

Many turned away from Jesus because they could not accept His teaching. Spiritually, turning away can be the beginnings of interior growth. We make up our own mind *(can't say yes until you can say no!)*. We no longer accept things on the say so of others. We no longer pay lip service. This encounter with Christ may be negative but it is *real* rather than *illusory*. To the extent that we reject Christ's spiritual teaching we encounter our own worldly state of being and thinking: and this is where the real work is done.

The Gospel describes this worldly, secular state of being and thinking... how we, 'put aside the commandments of God and cling to human traditions.' How we pay lip service to the things of Spirit (God) but prioritise our secular world first. How we mistake inner being as a function of the outer world, taking refuge in traditions, repetitive behaviour, social customs and so on. Our spiritual nature might awaken with the profound realisation that living this way will never satisfy.

In terms of the world the secular is necessary (give unto Caesar...). We are not asked to give it up but to become *aware* of it; to see it for what it really is. In awareness we come to 'see' how we have become bound by traditions, social customs and personal image making; how, 'we've always done it that way'. It is the seeing that is important. It creates a space where we can expand beyond the confines of worldly limitation and encounter the spiritual. We begin to understand the meaning and truth of Christ's teaching; *my* words are spirit and they are life. Our inner being will become more like His. As the world is actually a function of inner being: and, to the extent that inner being becomes Christ like... we change the face of the world.


