SAINTS PETER & PAUL, APOSTLES

From Father Anthony

I was up before sunrise saying my prayers, making tea and packing the car. Then to St Gregory's for Mass followed by over five hours of driving. The sky changed from breezy white candy floss to oil rag black and buckets of rain. Then I was walking along the seashore, seagulls flocking and flapping, crying into a wind that blasted sand against bare legs. A day of opposites and conversions.

Opposites and conversions might apply to those titans of the church, Peter and Paul. In the Preface of Peter and Paul we read: "For by your providence the blessed Apostles Peter and Paul bring us joy: Peter, foremost in confessing the faith, Paul, its outstanding preacher, Peter, who established the early Church from the remnant of Israel, Paul, master and teacher of the Gentiles..."

Peter established a firm base for the church characterised by Faith: Paul brought that Faith to the world through tireless preaching. Peter, meaning rock, begins as Simon meaning to hear: he learns to discern what is and what is not of God accepting the former and rejecting the latter becoming solid, as firm as rock. Saul becomes Paul; the S sound becomes a P sound indicating a movement from teaching - the L sound - by violence to teaching through words and persuasion; his human will power is converted through experience of and faith and knowledge in Jesus. Both Peter and Paul undergo conversion. How?

To both is revealed the gift of how to use the Keys to the Kingdom of Heaven... Binding and Loosing. Binding has to do with what we affirm; loosing has to do with what we deny or push away. Ultimately we loose or deny ourselves. What we loose or surrender to God (Heaven) comes back to us transformed spiritually ('binded'). Now we can use our transformed, converted life in service of either the churches Mission or Maintenance or both.

It is vital that each of us undergo this conversion. Only the converted soul can bring the life of Christ to a world sinking ever deeper into a mire of war and death... especially with latest Abortion and Assisted Suicide Bills. If our politics and laws are rotten, maybe they are a reflection of a rotten core in society. If so, it is our task to transform that society in Love, so that our politics and laws reflect Christ whom we bring to it.

ADVANCE NOTICE – SUNDAY MASS TIME CHANGE: 13 JULY

Please note in your diary! On Sunday 13 July, due to priest availability, Mass times will be as follows:

9am – St Osmund's Church 11am – St Gregory's Church 12.30pm – Ordinariate Mass in St Osmund's Church 6pm – St Osmund's Church

For clarity:

There will be <u>no</u> 9am Mass at St Gregory's Church and <u>no</u> 11am Mass at St Osmund's Church. The Saturday Evening Vigil Mass (6pm at St Gregory's on 12 July) will go ahead as normal.

ST OSMUND'S ORGAN

Sadly, we must inform you that the leather on the bellows of our pipe organ is splitting. Our organ has been a vital part of St Osmund's liturgy for over 175 years and the organ builders believe that the current leather is original! Now that it has split we have no option but to replace it if we are to continue using the organ. The bellows are the 'lungs' of the instrument which provide a constant flow of air to the pipes. As leather ages it becomes brittle, causing bellows to leak and eventually blow-out. You may have already noticed the 'breezy' sound in that corner of the church and soon, we may notice loud wind leaks, drastic escape of air, drops in the organ's pitch and volume and possibly even complete failure. The leather is sheepskin, which is tanned and then cut into various thicknesses which are appropriate for the job and is normally expected to last many, many years. Re-leathering entails removal of all the original leather, cleaning and repairing the woodwork, then applying new sheepskin in exactly the same manner as the original. We anticipate the costs of the project will be around £7000 and so we will be launching a fund-raising effort very soon. If you have any fundraising ideas and/or would like to be part of a team to raise the funds needed for this vital work, please contact Caroline in the parish office.

We will keep you updated as we receive further information from the organ builders and our parish finance team as to if/when we can go ahead with repairs. In the meantime...if the organ begins to sound a little strange...please don't blame the organists!

Thursday 3 July - Feast of St Thomas, Apostle. We will welcome the whole of St Osmund's Primary School at the 10am Mass. Therefore there will be limited space in the church but seating in the overflow in the hall will be available.

PILGRIMAGE OF HOPE

The Pilgrimage of Hope is a national walking pilgrimage with four main Ways converging at the Cathedral of St Barnabas, Nottingham, on Saturday 13th September 2025, for shared prayer and celebration. The Pilgrimage will culminate with Solemn Mass for the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross at 11.15 am on 14 September 2025 at St Barnabas' Cathedral.

The four main Ways, named after the Evangelists, Saints Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, start at the Catholic cathedrals in Cardiff, Leeds, Norwich and London, and will bless our nations with a Sign of the Cross. A small group of 'perpetual pilgrims' will walk the full distance of each Way and they will be joined by 'day pilgrims' as they journey from one parish to the next.

Our own David Blake will be walking St Matthew's Way which starts at the Cathedral of St David in Cardiff to Nottingham Cathedral via St Chad's Cathedral in Birmingham, a distance of 210 miles. During his journey he will be carrying on his backpack a large cross from St Osmund's School and you can support him by helping to raise funds for our 'Parish Centre' or by joining him for a day or two along the way.
