From Father Anthony

Summer held on with blue sky, puffs of white cloud and a blazing hot sun. The tide was out. We combed pebbles and vast sandy beaches for sea glass, petted dogs, chatted to their owners and managed to walk round a normally impassable promontory of rock. The sight was breathtaking. A spotless curved beach of golden sand framed by sheer high cliffs. Normally it was dangerously cut off at both ends unless the tide was right out: and the tide turned, so we reluctantly retraced our steps... only to find we had been beaten by it at our farther exit. I had miscalculated, missed the mark! I thanked God for some old sea stairs cut into the promenade wall; they saved the day and kept us dry!

If your hand, foot or eye should cause you to sin cut it off. Sounds barbaric and not worthy of a loving God. But, for the ancient semitic mind the hand is what we create with: a tool of the mind. The feet bring harmony and balance and the eye perception and insight. So, if your mind mis-creates, or you are out of balance or your perception and insight are awry, causing you to sin (miss the mark, get it wrong) then change them, cut them off... we call it repentance.

One way we sin or miss the mark, is in our understanding of who Jesus is. In the minds of many He is just another holy man, a good person, an 'ascended master' and so on. This increasingly prevalent view cuts us off from who He actually is - the unknowable God made visible, known and approachable: the Person out of and through whom the universe and all else comes into being. Coming into His Presence is often coming into a mental idea of who we think He is. This we need to cut off, otherwise it is a false Jesus we accept and teach to others... the little ones in the Gospel.

Like Moses we must have a first hand experience of who He actually is. We must climb the mountain and meet Him as He is and on his own terms, i.e. in spirit. Having had a real experience of Him then, like Moses communicating Him to the seventy elders, we will be able to communicate Him to others. Our journey begins with prayer where He communicates Himself to us.
