# Palm Sunday & Holy Week

#### **From Father Anthony**

Some weeks back I went into the countryside. Apart from birdsong and distant traffic it was quiet with a cold but gentle breeze. Trees stood tall on my left while the landscape fell away to the right with exquisite views towards Wardour. Two women on horseback made their way along a weathered track. Something spooked one of the horses. It neighed and rose up, dancing on its hindlegs. With amazing skill, the rider leaned forward kept her balance and controlled the skittering horse. Visibly shaken she, nevertheless, patted the horse and continued on her way. It made me think of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem on a donkey.

Spiritually, Jerusalem is a symbol of Peace. It is this peace we hope to attain through spiritual practice – especially during Lent. Very often the donkey *(or horse)* is spiritually symbolic of the Mind. Tethered to the world *(you will find a donkey tethered)* the mind is tied to the senses; which are unstable and may lead us a merry dance! The mind has to be freed from the senses by being controlled *by* and *in* Love... Jesus rides *(controls)* the donkey *(mind)*. The donkey is also the mount of a King... the controlled mind is King. The King comes meek and mild means... *not bearing weapons*. The controlled mind is quietly confident. It does not argue with or attack others but it does not succumb to the whims or conditioning of society. It is marvellous: yet terrifying.

The controlled, self-actualised, person, being secure in themselves, is liberated. They liberate others. They free others to grow in spirit and are often a joy to be with: we welcome them *(palms)*. *But*, they are a threat to those still captivated by the herd mentality. The threatened will ridicule and *dumb down* such a person at best – get rid of or kill them them at worse! Similarly, as we grow in spirit we will encounter in ourselves the voice of liberation and the voice of criticism. We may feel our new-found liberation *is of the devil!* It may depress and confuse us and we may supress or kill it.

To distinguish what is of God and what is of the World needs great discernment. It can be a tough time... the desert outside the city, the storm before the calm, death before resurrection. However, such confusion is often a sign that Christ is near at hand!

# HOLY REDEEMER CONSULTATION

Last weekend at all Masses, an announcement was made that a parish-wide consultation about the future of The Most Holy Redeemer Church was to be launched. During the week, Fr Anthony emailed all registered parishioners the following message:

We are currently preparing for a future where fewer priests will serve larger areas with the possibility of diminishing congregations and income. Our parish has three church buildings within 2 miles of each other and the roof at Holy Redeemer requires extensive essential repairs if it is to remain open. Therefore, we must ask the question whether our mission in this city is best served by raising sufficient funds to repair and maintain this building. If not, should we redevelop the land in order to provide an income for the future? It goes without saying that this would be a very difficult and sad decision to have to take, given the fondness which many of us share for this beautiful and community-built church.

The salient facts are:

The church is used twice-weekly for a congregation of between thirty to ninety persons.

Projected essential repair costs are between £K500 - £1m.

Even if we could raise the money (which is doubtful), there is a compelling moral argument as to whether we should, weighing cost against strategic necessity and projected usage.

Closing the church would cause inconvenience and sadness but there are two other churches to choose from within a short distance.

With fewer priests and diminishing congregations - and therefore diminishing finance - redevelopment of the land may eventually provide an income for the future mission of the Church in Salisbury.

If the church does close, the Saturday Evening Mass will migrate to one of our other two churches.

Permission to conduct this consultation was granted by Bishop Declan on 7 February 2023 and the final decision will rest with him. It is my hope that through a period of discernment, prayer and dialogue we can provide him with the best possible evidence to inform the decision-making process.
