THE MOST HOLY BODY AND Blood of Christ

The warm, inviting aroma of freshly baked bread filled the kitchen. Rain tapped against the window panes; seagulls stood in line on an adjacent rooftop, their cries lost in the wind. Now! the only thing to have with freshly baked bread is... more freshly baked bread... and butter, of course,...and tea. I tucked in and thought about the Hebrew word for bread, Lechem

.(לחם) this Hebrew root can also convey war and struggle (people fight over bread); it can also mean to be pressed together. I wondered what was going through Jesus' mind when he left us bread for His Body and wine for His Blood. It is the subject of many writings, intellectual and emotional arguments and great soul searching.

Our belief is that bread and wine become, through a process of transubstantiation (*a change of one substance to another*) the real Body and Blood of Jesus. The form remains the same but the substance differs. This is not 'consubstantiation' (the presence of Jesus residing alongside form and substance); nor is it symbolic (made meaningful by the *level of consciousness* we or others bring to it). Many ask, and so might we, did Jesus mean what He said literally; or did He mean something else.

In the face of any great mystery, 'old Basil' was insistent that, we approach it directly... "be silent and humble and let the mystery speak to you in your heart; don't be noisy and arrogantly interrogate it". The approach to be taken is given in the Gospel in the context of preparation. Being His disciples we too must ask, where He wants us to go in order to prepare for the Passover; to encounter the Last Supper, the mystery of His Body and Blood.

His instruction is to go into the city, into our intellectual and emotional being. There we will meet ourselves in soul, *the man carrying a pitcher of water* (symbol of the embodied soul). Loosened from our focus on the world we journey (follow) within now focussed on Spirit *(the master of the house)*. Here we experience *our higher consciousness, our upper room*. It is the Guest room. It operates beyond intellect and emotion through Love; Love which is at one with the mind of the other... the Guest. Being of one Mind we now understand His Mind: in that understanding is revealed the mystery of His Body and Blood.

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) - Sunday 2 June

Standing at the crowded table of the Upper Room during the Last Supper, Jesus Christ did not hand out bibles to the Twelve Apostles and solemnly tell them, "Take this, all of you, and read it. This is my book, written for you." Jesus gives us Himself, not a book. On today's Feast, we commemorate God's greatest gift to mankind, the person of Jesus Christ. God gives us His Son, and then Christ gives us Himself, body and blood, soul and divinity, under the *appearance* of bread and wine in the Holy Eucharist. Gift, gift-giver, and receiver meld into one in this Sacrament of Sacraments. We have a short video on the origin of this feast and an even shorter 'Pathe News' item from 1934.
