SAINTS PETER & PAUL, APOSTLES

From Father Anthony


I listened to gangsters quarrelling on the school roof as the sun peered over the horizon. A priest challenged a friend of mine: 'just how serious are you about the church? It's not an 'in and out' private devotional sport, you know. It's about being part of a worshipping community; Us. What part do you play in it? what are you giving to it? not just financially but of yourself'. 'Ouch' I thought, as I sipped the tea. My friend had been incensed... and took it out on me! I cooled him down but it made me think. Does that challenge apply to you and me?

The two great leaders of the Church, Peter and Paul were challenged by Jesus; Peter with 'who do you say I am'; and Paul with; 'why are you persecuting me'. We might ask how Jesus is challenging us? Peter and Paul can assist us in discovering an answer as they are representative of spiritual qualities we must develop in order to lead the church into the future. Their very names indicate something of these qualities.

Simon becomes Peter; Saul becomes Paul. Simon is a quality of interior attention (hearing) which allows us to discern what is not of God; we know God by constantly knowing what He is not. This *via negativa* develops Faith; we become rocklike and foundational in God - meaning of Peter. Paul's name presents a different but similar quality. The 'L' sound in both Saul and Paul represents a Staff, symbolic of a Leader or Teacher. The S sound in Saul is a tooth and indicates leadership or teaching by force or coercion (teeth devour); Saul persecuted Christians in favour of the Law. After his encounter with Jesus, on the road to Damascus, the S sound changes to a P sound; meaning a mouth. Now he leads and teaches by the Word not by Force: and what a teacher!

Each one of us has a place in the church with unique spiritual gifts based in Faith and Teaching. When Jesus challenges us it is not to humiliate but to assist us to grow in and offer our gifts to one another... painful at times. As a community, one of our tasks, surely, is to help each other grow in confidence to share our gifts. But we must become aware of them first and for that we might need to be challenged!

Wednesday Mass 3 July - The children at St Osmund's School are no longer able to join us for St Thomas' Day Mass on Wednesday. Therefore, despite our earlier announcement, the Mass will at St Gregory's at 10am as normal.

13th SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

In the normal 'run of things', this Sunday would have been the 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time (B). However, with 29 June falling on a Saturday this year, the Solemnity of the Feast of St Peter and Paul is moved to the Sunday.

Fr Anthony had already prepared his exegesis for us based on the scripture of the 13th Sunday before we noticed this! It seems a shame not to publish it - especially for those who like to follow the lectionary sequence of the Sunday Gospels and anticipate his reflections upon them. Please find below Fr Anthony's musings on the 13th Sunday scripture if this had not occurred. A double dose! Enjoy:

From Fr Anthony

I parked Agnes, found an empty hide, opened the window and settled down. The lake stretched before me rippling in the breeze. Canada Geese honked in the distance: a swan glided by. Reed, sedge and garden warblers, warbled. Clouds of damselflies hovered about the reedbeds and an emperor dragon fly, glinting in the sun, caught insects on the wing. Hidden below all this life, the murky depths of the lake stirred.

The soul, lost in worldly thoughts, guided by worldly wisdom and attached to many things longs to hear, in spirit, the loving, gentle words of Jesus "Talithia cumi," These two Aramaic words, have the sense of "Arise, dear little girl". From the murky depths of our soul we long to rise to the Life this Gospel passage promises.

Spiritually the *girl* and the *woman with haemorrhages* are aspect of Jairus's soul - *the soul represented as feminine*. Jairus, from the verb, ') לוס הירס' 'to shine' and its derivative ' שונה flow', (i.e. liquid light), represents the image of God we are: we shine as the light of the world and flow with spiritual life. Yet, something is wrong. Both the little girl and woman (*light and life of the soul*) have suffered for twelve years: the twelve spiritual faculties that comprise our centre, our 'I Am' - Faith, Strength, Wisdom, Love, Power, Imagination, Understanding, Will, Order, Zeal, Renunciation and Life - are under the influence of and conditioned by the world (*Jairus was an 'official' of the synagogue*).

When the world attempts to lead and bind spirit, the result is a sense of dysfunction, death and decay because it is incorrectly ordered. Spirit leads, the world follows. When we reverse this order: when we have, "suffered greatly at the hands of many physicians" and "have spent all that we have", something feels dead within us (little girl); our life force does not flow: we bring nothing to birth within (woman with a haemorrhage). This, of course, is nonsense to the world and is met with ridicule, (they ridiculed Him).

Only as we find and become one with Christ within will we be healed and awaken to and operate under the correct order. For that we must banish fear and exercise our primary faculty... Faith (do not be afraid: only believe). We must practice listening interiorly for his voice and feel His presence within (touch the hem of his garment).
