From Father Anthony

It was a glorious day; sun, nectar and a gentle breeze. Blue sky reflected off ripples dancing to the echo of birdsong across the lake. A train provided rhythm with its clickerty clack. The only disturbance was a young pup barking and chasing its tail. Any moment now, I thought, he will stop and bump into himself! With a howl something like that happened!

Often, when asked, 'what made you what you are', the answer will be 'I went through a really hard time' - not, something fun or pleasurable but, something heavy, dark and terrible: losing a loved one, losing a job, failing at something longed for. Hard times can bring us home to ourselves with a bump. In the story of the prodigal son this coming home to 'self' is translated as 'he came to his senses'. The word translated as senses is the reflexive pronoun Èautoũ heautou, meaning himself, herself, itself: i.e. the subject of the verb is also the object... the action is on oneself.

It is through knowing and acting on ourselves that we come to know God, others and what we have been given. We have been given freedom to separate (incarnation); to leave the spiritual realm for the physical and go our own way; we have become little less than god's (Psalm 8.5). But, being less than God we get it wrong. We behave prodigally: we act without control, indulging in the variants of sex, money and power... just look at the world! We become blind to our origin, forget who and what we really are and, consequently, miss the mark (sin); where the mark is to live as God lives. Awareness of sin has the potential to brings us to ourselves.

Understanding sin for what it is can be the agency that wakes us up to the freedom God has given us. The alternative to our earthly journey would have been to stay behind like the older son: the price for that would have been a missed opportunity to know God, ourselves and all we have been given in freedom (remember, the Father had to tell the older son that all He (God) had was his... the son did not know it!)

Let's stop chasing our tails, bump into ourselves, wake up and remember God. Let's reverse the journey away from God and use our freedom to journey towards Him... and Love.

Presentation of the Creed & Second Scrutiny for the Elect

The Elect are those in the final stage of their journey to become fully incorporated into the Catholic Church at Easter through the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Eucharist. The Rites taking place this weekend are embedded in our Year A Scripture with its focus upon turning away from darkness and towards Christ who is The Light. This Friday's evening Mass, the Elect will be presented with The Creed so that they, like the Man Born Blind, will be ready to state 'I believe' as they turn away from darkness and towards the light. Our second reading from St Paul reminds us that we are in darkness no more but that we now *are* light in the Lord and that this light must shine through our goodness, right-living and truth. The second scrutiny will take place at the 9am Mass at St Osmund, this is an important occasion in the life of the whole parish and so the Year A scripture will be adopted at all Masses.

Laetare Sunday 30 March

Laetare means rejoice, and this Sunday is marked by a relaxation of the penitential character of the Lenten season. On this Sunday, we look with expectation to the great Solemnity of Easter for which we have been preparing ourselves as a Church during the Lenten season. By its anticipation of the joy of Easter, Laetare Sunday is meant to give us hope and encouragement as we slowly progress towards the Paschal Feast. Priests used to wear pink rose vestments on this Sunday as a sign of joy. The use of rose vestments probably stems from an ancient papal tradition of blessing golden roses which would be sent to Catholic heads of state in Europe on the Fourth Sunday of Lent.
