I sat looking out of the window. It was very early with a clear black sky studded with

a vast array of stars. Satellites tracked from corner to corner; red and green navigation lights flickered followed by the deep hush of jets: bats did last minute wingovers avoiding the window. Finally, the sun announced its arrival with a dim red, rising halo. Another day on its way! ... but I enjoyed the dark stillness and rest. And it came to pass going into the house of one of the chief pharisees to eat bread on a sabbath... Among other things the Sabbath points towards rest: a cessation from doing things... a cessation from the chattering mind and noisy cluttered thoughts. Of course, the world wants to keep us active, tense, responsive to its lies, its 'science', its concept of society, it rules and regulations, its advertising, media and so on. And we wonder why mental health issues are rising! The world wants to be its own master and creator; it does not want us interested in or coming close to the Creator. It often laughs at or scorns God as an outdated concept or a vengeful, dictatorial myth. Yet, this is not the experience of the Saints, Mystics and many others. In God they find perfect stillness and rest: no anger, retribution, judgement or condemnation; just Love: the still point from which everything and nothing emanates. Once again, He is Cause; all else effect. Abiding in Him brings rest and

The Gospel passage urges us to acknowledge the pharisaic, worldly aspect of our life, enter it and bring it to rest. Don't run from the world; actively bring it to rest. Still its active wheels from turning... just for a while. Allow its mind to wind down. The world is like a seesaw going up and down but going nowhere. It's up to us to bring it to balance: the midpoint, which is God, fulness and fulfilment.

For this to happen in the world, of course, it must happen in us. Our actions, prayers and meditation must bring us to rest in Divine stillness. In this stillness we come to see how poor we are in spirit; how pompous, arrogant and self-entitled we are in thought and worldly ways. Awareness of this allows us to balance our worldly and spiritual nature... which is the marriage mentioned in the Gospel
