ORDINARY TIME WEEK (31A)

From Father Anthony

I fell out of bed, found the Lord's feet, said the Divine Office and Rosary and surveyed my interior state in something resembling Meditation. Then, I crept downstairs, opened the church, lit a candle and performed another ritual... Orange Pekoe, mint leaves and a little honey! Outside, in early morning mist, fragrant tea steaming, I listened to bird song; pure unalloyed prayer; unlike mine with the head saying one thing and the heart another!

'Do as they say not as they do'. Words of life can be spoken by a soul full of death. I admit I have found this to be true. I have dressed up in those fine robes: I have been entertained and feted; I have been given titles and decorations: I have spoken fine words - which, in truth were not mine but His. Under the veneer of piety and holiness I have acted and behaved to the contrary; self-interest, self-glorification, self-gain mixed with domination or suppression of others. And yes... I am ashamed of it.

Our Rites and Practices contain what they are symbolic of: they should reflect a living substance within us; our soul gaining in understanding, insight and wisdom. Where this substance is not present or, at least, in the process of growing we remain empty and interiorly formless. This substance is cultivated and formed by prayer, devotion and practice. In prayer we allow God to see Himself through our 'eyes' as we understand ourselves through His. Devotion places us in a subordinate position; the longing heart rushing towards Him only to find Him rushing even faster towards us! Practise aids and inspires prayer and devotion. It is the use of awareness to illumine our thinking, feeling and acting against conscience; to see some good in everything and remain open. Prayer, devotion and practise form a trinity; a substance within.

The starting place for this is simple... recognition of our need for humility and honesty. Remember: the higher formation bows down to the lower because without the lower the higher cannot stand. The plant is a higher formation than the earth but without the earth the plant cannot stand, etc. - Jesus washes the feet of the disciples! The humble soul learns to get out of the way of itself so that God can be God in the humble soul; and, therefore, the humble soul knows what it is like to be God!


