From Father Anthony

I sat on my favourite bench on the promontory looking out to sea. The air was salty and heavily scented with sea weed. A flock of wheezing starlings swooped upon discarded fish and chips, dive bombed by hungry seagulls. I let the sun fry my arms and legs and listened to the surf gently caressing the shore. In the mid distance men on boats heaved, hauled and pulled up heavy pots from the deep labouring against a heavy swell.

"The harvest is plentiful but the labourers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out labourers for his harvest." Very often a labourer conjures up an images of people working in fields or on boats or on building sites. But, there is another image less prolific; that of people labouring at the spiritual life: labouring at transforming themselves from an animated being to a life giving spirit. This labour was anciently known as 'the Work', or 'the Way'. The Gospel implies that few are willing to begin and sustain this Work... hence the labourers are few. Many want the fruits of Spirit but are not prepared to work for it. One reason is that the things of this world, the things we really work for (haversack, sandals, money, etc) are of no use and only hinder us in spiritual work. Spiritual work demands we overcome the world, i.e. detach from materiality, human systems, laws, personal ego and anything that is not eternal. Consequently we feel vulnerable like spiritual lambs among material wolves... and we don't like it!

Those who do embark on spiritual labours and persevere are those whom the Lord sends back into the world to bring it the peace, understanding, order and fulfilment the world on its own cannot achieve. No worldly force can transform the world and save it; no politics, laws, systems or theories. These are all derivatives. Only Spirit, which is original and plentiful (the harvest), can transform and save. The 'Work' is as radical as repentance... a change of mind and heart; an intention to leave the worldly for the spiritual in order to bring the spiritual back to the worldly. The good news is that it is a work that God does in us... pray the Master of the harvest. If not already, let us pray to the master for the intention and perseverance to become labourers in spirit.

IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENTS

Fr Jonathan Creer has been appointed by the bishop of Northampton and the bishop of the Ordinariate to serve two diocesan parishes in Northamptonshire (Thrapston & Oundle). Fr Jonathan will continue to work with us officially until the end of July although it is his plan to celebrate some of the Masses in Salisbury on Sundays in August, to enable everyone to say their goodbyes - we will keep you informed as to where he will be as the weeks unfold. We thank Fr Jonathan for all that he has brought to our parishes over the last six years and assure him of our prayers as he prepares for the new challenge ahead.

Fr Saji Mathew, currently Parish Priest of Christ the King in Amesbury, has been appointed by Bishop Bosco to serve the parish of Holy Family in Patchway, Bristol. He will be taking up his new position from September, and similarly, we will keep you informed as to which Sunday Masses Fr Saji will be celebrating, to enable parishioners to wish him well as he leaves our Pastoral Area.

We are expecting a priest to arrive in Amesbury in September, although details are yet to be announced by the diocese. We do not know yet if, or when, a priest may be allocated to replace Fr Jonathan in his diocesan capacity, but we are anticipating that an Ordinariate priest will be sent to serve the Sarum Ordinariate group in due course. Let us keep asking to the Holy Spirit to send labourers to the harvest, to call good men to the priesthood, and to bless our Bishop Bosco and all those priests across the diocese who are preparing to move parishes this Autumn.

For clarity:

There will be <u>no</u> 9am Mass at St Gregory's Church and <u>no</u> 11am Mass at St Osmund's Church after this coming weekend (6 July). The two 6pm evening Masses (Saturday & Sunday) will continue as previously.

This arrangement will have an impact on many people and all our Masses and so we invite everyone to approach this new arrangement in a spirit of generosity and welcoming. Once the situation is more settled, the weekend Mass arrangements across the Pastoral Area of St Edith of Wilton (which includes Salisbury, Amesbury, Warminster and Tisbury/Wardour) will be reviewed.

UPDATE ON OUR ORGANS

St Osmund's Organ - We are pleased to share with you the **wonderful news** that parishioners who wish to remain anonymous have stepped forward to such an extent and with such generosity that we are now confident that the work required on the St Osmund's organ can go ahead without delay. In accordance with diocesan policy, we are seeking quotes for the work and will report back to you once the finance and property team have chosen the most suitable Organ Builders. This means that the organ will be out of action for a period of time at some point this year, but its future now looks secure. Praise be!

St Gregory's Organ - The refurbishment work on the soundboard *already underway* on the Father Willis organ at St Gregory's continues and, thanks to a generous contribution specifically to clean the organ pipes whilst it is dissembled, this work will soon be going ahead also. We anticipate that it will be back in use by the end of August. There remains a funding shortfall of around £1500 for the soundboard work and so any fundraising ideas for this would still be gratefully received.

VESTMENTS

This weekend at St Osmund's, we will be blessing a new set of green vestments which have been donated in memory of a young man who died last year, Hansel Dcruz. The design is a special "Pugin style", chosen to match the church architecture. Hansel's family wanted to donate specifically for something that would be of enduring liturgical use. Until now, the church hasn't had any vestment sets which actually belong to the parish which include the priest's chasuble, two deacon's dalmatics, and the veil and burse which cover the chalice. The Ordinariate community have subsequently given money to enable a purple set to be made, in memory of Fr Keith Robinson who served here so faithfully and whose funeral took place on Friday. These will soon be made to order, blessed and brought into service in time for Advent. If you would like to make a gift of a vestment in memory of a loved one, or in thanksgiving for prayers answered, please let us know. We do hope, in time, to have a set in each liturgical colour (green, purple, white and red). Each item will have a label sewn into it, reminding the wearer to pray for the intentions of the donor when it is worn. The vestments are handmade and of high quality, so should last for many, many years to come. The current prices are: £1,200 for a full colour set, or: £300 for a chasuble/dalmatic, £60 for a stole, £120 for the chalice veil and burse.
