From Father Anthony

It was a day with an identity crisis... all four seasons, repeating. I walked along Catherine Street to the square. Market day was ending... chaos. The serried ranks of colourful stalls were now reduced to poles, tarpaulins, open doored vans and bodies heaving this and that. I called out teasingly to those I knew and made my way towards the bridge... umbrella unfurled. Later the square had returned to its normal peace and calm.

The Gospel passage describes the human condition and the effects of unbalanced human nature referred to last week. We are created by God in a relationship of son or daughter - *we are not accidents of biology*. We have a religious nature (*vineyard*) within which to develop this relationship: boundaries have been set to give the relationship shape (*hedges*). We are given a deep sense of who we are, our I Am (*winepress*): made of the same essence as the Father so that we can recognise and communicate with Him. Our experience is set in a body (*tower*). This is our stall. But: have we taken it down!

The husbandmen - that part of our nature created to supervise spiritual development (season of fruits) - have taken over and reduced everything to a function of human laws, personal gain, and subtle idolatry (materialism). Chaos. Any spiritual assistance sent to us (servants and son) is seen as an intrusion. The light cannot enter because we lean towards darkness. We have become a function of worldliness: empty human laws and religious practices devoid of the true light. Have we become unbalanced?

The True Light, of course, can never be defeated by darkness. Our task is to redress the lack of balance and let the light in *(put those wretches to a wretched end)*. How?

Our natural spiritual light is *awareness:* the ability to see, *(illuminate)* what we do through observation. We can illuminate our thinking, feeling and doing, balancing what we see against our natural religious sense *(conscience).* Next, we can try to see some good in every situation because, God is in everything; we can find something of Him wherever we are and in whatever we see. Finally, we can remain open to everything; which is not the same as following everything! In this openness we might see what we have rejected... which might become the corner stone on which we shape our character in the Father's image.

As it is many years since we were last able to use this space and we know that many parishioners will never have seen inside...so we are providing a number of opportunities for you to come and take a look:

Saturday 28 October - from 10.30am until 1.30pm - an Open Day when you can pop in, have a chat with one of the clergy who will be there to greet you and offer you a drink and biscuit.

Sunday 29 October - the 'after-Mass' coffee, that takes place between the 9am & 11am Masses will, on this day take place in the Social Centre to encourage as many people as possible to take the trip up Exeter Street to have a look!

Saturday 4 November - there will be a facilitated workshop to which all parishioners are invited from 11am until 3pm in St Elizabeth Hall. This will allow us to explore together how we can best use the centre to build the parish community, how we might go about that, who would like to be involved, how we afford it..etc. etc. **Please put the date in your diary** and attend if you can. There will be a break for lunch.
