THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT Year of Mission

Have you picked up on that theme of Covenant this year through our Lenten journey? From Noah to Abraham and now with Moses and the People of Israel on Mount Sinai, God reaches out to his people in a desire to come close to them and draw them into his love. The Commandments were to shape the way God's people lived their lives. This was the way of living that marked them out as God's people and as distinct from other nations. And these are God's words, not the words of Moses. It is God who speaks relationship to his people and we come to the understanding that it is God who inscribes these words on the two tablets of stone... and maybe it is important that we hold that image of stone and the covenant in our minds for a week or two until we come to Jeremiah! God seeks to inscribe his love within us for God seeks to come close to us this Lent because he loves us. As God shaped the People of Israel to become his people so he shapes and fashions us in Lent to radiate more perfectly his image and likeness. We grow in his likeness when we live as he calls us to live – in love with him and living in love of our neighbour, too.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION Gift Aid Envelopes – 2018-2019: Due to changes in the legal status of the Diocese, the envelopes for the year 2018 – 2019 will start in <u>March</u> rather than April. The new envelopes are available for collection. Please do NOT use up any older envelopes after the date printed on them as HMRC will not recognise them and we will not be able to claim the Gift Aid.

POPE FRANCIS MESSAGE - General Audience 28 February 2018 Liturgy of the Eucharist

Dear brothers and sisters: In our catechesis on the Mass, we now turn from the Liturgy of the Word to the Liturgy of the Eucharist. Following the Lord's command at the Last Supper to "do this in memory of me", the Church at every Mass makes sacramentally present the sacrifice of the New Covenant sealed by Jesus on the altar of the cross. The Liturgy of the Eucharist begins with the Preparation of the Gifts of bread and wine which will then be consecrated in the Eucharistic Prayer and received by the faithful in Holy Communion. The rite of the Preparation of the altar. The Prayer which concludes this rite voices our confidence that the Church's offering will be transformed by the Holy Spirit and become a sacrifice pleasing to the Father, in union with the sacrifice of Christ on the cross. At every Mass, may we experience the Preparation of the Gifts as an invitation to offer our lives completely to the Lord, in order to receive from him the grace to live ever more fully our vocation to grow in holiness and to serve the coming of his Kingdom.
